Fast-forward to 2015, when Green and Laura, in partnership with Scott Robertson, launched two exciting new businesses: the Infiniti Fitness Gym in Sale (infinitifitnessgym.co.uk), employing six coaches and with clients across the age and ability spectrum, and a complementary online venture, The Barbell Shop (barbellshop.co.uk). Green says, "When kitting out our gym we realised there was a great market opportunity for genuinely affordable high-quality gym equipment, so we created our own range, branded Iron Affair. It's humbling to help someone lose weight, gain confidence and move well for the first time in years. Our passions lie in making a difference to people's day-to-day lives."

Green is particularly enthusiastic about his CrossFit Kids after-school

classes, saying, "Just getting them moving and enjoying it, that's the main thing."

Clearly devoted to his 1-year-old son, Green lists his priorities as "father, husband, co-owner and coach." He appears to enjoy his lifestyle. "I get to hang around with great people, training," he says. "I can't call that a job!"
